

How The Passenger Assistant Training Scheme Works For Trainers

The PATS strategy is to provide training for people who are responsible for training passenger assistants. Called Passenger Assistant Trainers or PATS Trainers, these people are trainers who attend a training course to learn how to deliver the PATS programme locally using standard training materials.

Passenger Assistant Trainers attend a training course to learn how to set up and deliver the training programme to passenger assistants safely and effectively. They also must pass a presentation skills assessment and a theory assessment covering all the topics on the course. Candidates for this course will find that it is necessary to set aside time during the course for private study and for the preparation of a short presentation.

The Passenger Assistant Trainers course is divided into 4 modules. These modules are shown in the following table:
