Background

Good old days - hourly plus service (Edinburgh-Perth)

Pre 2019 Stagecoach two hourly service, then evening and Sunday commercial services withdrawn, replaced with PKC subsidised services (56)

2019 daytime services withdrawn, replaced with PKC subsidised service:

56 Glenfarg to Perth, two services per day, operated by Stagecoach. Running time 45 minutes. Only runs to north end of town (15-minute walk for me)

55 Glenfarg to Kinross, every two hours, operated by Earnside Coaches, big gap in afternoon. At the end of 2022, Earnside gave notice that they would be retiring

Removing the hurdles: why use the New 55...

Feedback told us:

Infrequent Service (2-hourly, 4-hourly)

Gaps in the morning and afternoon

Inconvenient route (eg 56 from Greenbank)

Haphazard connections

Time in towns either too short or too long

Onward journey in Perth difficult: Limited choice of destinations

Kids limited to one set school bus time

Rigid route

Bus perceived to be expensive

The new 55 BUS:

Hourly Service - Glenfarg to Kinross

First bus 0710 to connect with E1 to Edinburgh at Kinross P&R (arr 0849)

Flexible route with "wiggles"

20-minute, 1-hour-20min etc stopovers

"Affordable" fares: £2 single; £10 10-journey

Plans for Future

Extension to Perth ?202 (West Kinross-shire)

Wider range of destinations in Perth: Station, PRI, Retail Park, P&R
