

## CTWeek24 Photo Ideas

1 – Take an all-team photo. Gather your staff and volunteers together and take a photo of you all cheering/smiling. If you can do this in front of your premises sign or liveried vehicle – even better!

2 – Fill a vehicle with balloons and take a photo with your logo/organisation sign, in the photo. Fancy a go at making a balloon arch for your premises?
